Have you ever seen someone who looks familiar but you cannot remember why? Or perhaps someone you know well has changed their hair colour or style and you did not recognise them? Reading over the Gospel, a question springs immediately to mind: how could it be that disciples of Jesus would not recognise him, especially when his story was all they wanted to talk about to a complete stranger?

After the event it makes sense to them; 'Did not our hearts burn within us as he talked to us on the road and explained the scriptures to us?' they wonder, and they rush back to Jerusalem to share their story. The experience with Jesus, which culminated in the breaking of the bread, stirred something within them and piece by piece it all fell into place.

Perhaps they were not ready at the start and had to take a journey with Jesus (even one in the 'wrong direction') to arrive finally at a place where they were able to recognise him and become what they were supposed to be – disciples. Once they had come to recognition they did what all good disciples should – rushed off to tell others!
